Design, Access and Heritage Statement

1. Why the container is required.

The container is required for the storage of rugby training equipment and match day equipment which is used on the pit rugby field by Kells ARLFC Raptors (age 4) through to open age teams. Equipment includes, goal post covers, tackle bags, poles, shields and balls.

The club is not situated on the field so that option is not available to the coaches. Historically neighbours have been kind enough to allow us to store equipment in their garages but understandably these options are no longer available leaving us without anywhere for the equipment.

2. Why the scale and design of the container has been chosen.

We have opted for the smallest container that would store all the equipment so that it would not be an eye sore or obstructive.

We met with the National Trust and Land Trust and agreed this location was the best to avoid being obstructive to anyone's views. This location has the highest mound of soil/grass giving the container the most natural cover of any other point.
